Jackets


With fall comes cooler temperatures.

 Then put your middle finger underneath for support.

If you would like to help your child work on their pencil grasp, please refer to the diagram below. One thing we do at preschool is to have the children hold a cotton ball in the three folded fingers. Giving them something to hold seems to help encourage the correct "tripod grasp".

Halloween Party






Snack
